Caus of the Crusades

- Muslims don't bother Christians who visit region.
- Late 1000's a group of Turkish Muslims entered and captured Jerusalem.
- Turks took control of Holy Land, caused to fight
- Turks threaten Constantinople in 1090's
- Tension grew between Christians, Jews, and Muslims.
